

# ASIAN INTERCITY BOWLING COUNCIL

AIBC was founded in Hong Kong on December 1986 to promote the sport of bowling, foster goodwill and better friendship among the Asian cities. This was formerly known as the PACIFIC INTERCITY TENPIN BOWLING COUNCIL. However, due to the participation of other Asian cities, it was reorganized and renamed ASIAN INTERCITY BOWLING COUNCIL (AIBC).

Currently the council has a membership of 18 cities and hosts annual bowling champion-ships. Our competitors contests for medals in Singles event, Doubles event, Team of Four event, All Events and Masters event. There are four divisions which include men and women's division and the senior men and women division for bowlers 50 years of age and above. The city with the highest medal points in the men and women's division is awarded the Overall Men and Women's City Championship Cup while the city team with the highest combined men and women's medal points is awarded the perpetual Shinzo Satoh

Cup.

## **MEMBERSHIP**

- Three (3) cities from each country / territory will be admitted as members of the AIBC with one
  guest city per country / territory.
- 2. Only one organization from a city or a district may be admitted to AIBC membership.
- 3. A city bowling organization can qualify for membership. The application for membership should meet the following requirements:
  - a. A written application must be submitted together with a copy of minutes showing that the application was approved and endorsed by an authorized person of that organization.
  - b. A copy of document to show that the organization is affiliated to its country's bowling congress federation or association must be submitted. This congress, federation or association must be a member of World Bowling and Asian Bowling Federation.
  - c. A list of the officers of the organization and information on the number of members must be submitted.
  - d. A letter from the City Hall or equivalent of the city your organization will be representing should be submitted to the AIBC. This letter should authorize the organization the privilege of representing the city in the Asian Intercity Bowling Council and the Asian Intercity Bowling Championship.
- 4. Action on each application for membership shall be taken by the AIBC Congress following recommendation by the AIBC Executive Committee. The decision regarding acceptance shall be made by the AIBC by simple majority.

#### **MEMBERSHIP FEES**

- 1. Membership fee is \$400.00 paid annually during the hosting of the championship at the Team Manager's meeting. Guest city fee is \$500.00.
- 2. Induction fee is collected for first time city participants. This fee is \$400.00 payable with the annual membership fee. (A total of \$800.00.)

## **TOURNAMENT FEES**

1. Tournament fees are also collected during the Team Manager's meeting by the Executive Secretary or his/her designate as follows:

A. Men's Team: \$450.00
 B. Women's Team: \$450.00
 C. Men's Senior Team: \$450.00
 D. Women's Senior Team: \$450.00

These fees include up to four bowlers per team, one team manager and one coach.

2. Supporter fees must also be paid to the Executive Secretary during the Team Manager's Meeting. A supporter is defined as a person who is not a coach, manager or athlete competing in the championship. The fee shall be \$100.00 per person.

## ASIAN INTERCITY BOWLING CHAMPIONSHIP UNIFORM REGULATIONS

- 1. All bowlers must be in uniform during competition. This includes design and color. No variations will be permitted.
  - A. Acceptable forms of shirt include the following:
    - i. polo shirts
    - ii. t-shirt
  - B. Acceptable forms of articles for the bottom include the following for men:
    - i. Dress Pants
    - ii. Track Pants
    - iii. Dress Shorts
      - a. Length of the shorts must be the same. The team will either all be in shorts with length above the knee or all below the knee. Bowlers in a team will not be permitted to have different length sizes.
  - C. Acceptable forms of articles for the bottom include the following for women:
    - i. Dress Pants
    - ii. Track Pants
    - iii. Dress Shorts
      - a. Length of the shorts must be the same. The team will either all be in shorts with length above the knee or all below the knee. Bowlers in a team will not be permitted to have different length sizes.
    - iv. 34 Shorts
    - v. Skorts
    - vi. Skirts
      - a. Must be the same length for all members of the team. Either above the knee or below the knee.
      - d. Jeans or denim is NOT permitted.
- 2. AIBC patch must be placed on the right hand sleeve of the uniform.
- 3. Only the CITY name can appear on the uniform. The name of the city shall be on the back of the uniform.
- 4. Country name or flag are NOT allowed on the uniform.
- 5. Optional: City flag or emblem is allowed on the uniform.
